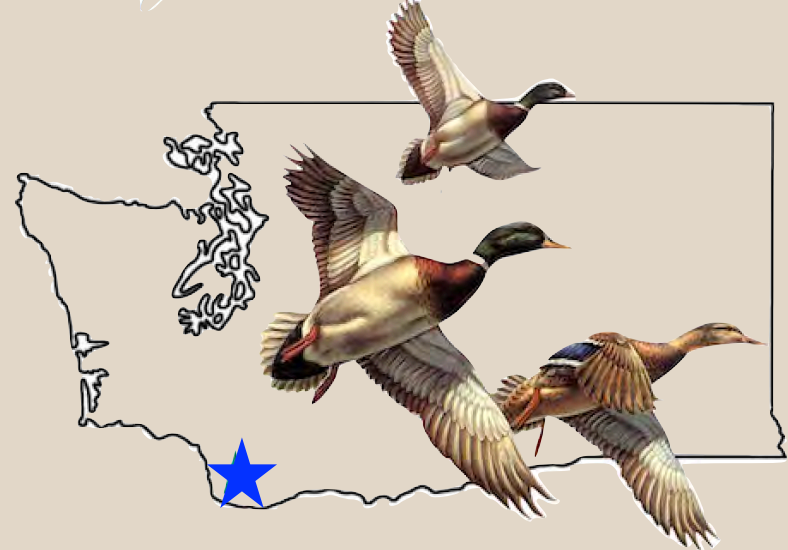

## 2019 Featured Artist - Jerry Simchuk

Jerry grew up in the Northwest where he began to develop his keen eye for wildlife and love of nature. Days spent fishing, hunting, hiking, and caring for a variety of animals on his family farm filled his days, while his nights were spent painting and exploring his growing affinity for art. The knowledge and sensitivity gained during this time would become the hallmarks of his realistic, highly detailed fine art bird sculptures.



In 1993, Jerry found woodcarving to be the perfect medium to express his artistic talents. He was drawn toward bird and fish sculptures, and deep down he knew this medium would be most rewarding, allowing him the ability to turn his love of wildlife into an art form.

Soon after finishing his first carved bird, Jerry entered his work in the Boise Woodcarvers Show in 1994 where he took top honors in his division. Since his first competition in 1994, Jerry Simchuk has competed regularly at top-level bird carving shows around the country, including the Ward World Championships. He has received numerous high level awards for his wildfowl and fish carvings, and his work has been selected to appear on the cover of Wildfowl Carving Magazine in 2007, 2008, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2018. As one of this nation's most respected and premier wildlife artists, Jerry Simchuk has been invited to judge many prestigious shows, including the Ward World Championships since 2004. With his passion for creating realistic bird sculptures in both wood and bronze, Jerry continues to share his knowledge and skill with others, offering seminars, classes and writing articles. Jerry finds it very rewarding to know he is helping others grow in their passion for this art form.

Jerry currently resides in Spokane Valley Washington with his wife Jean where he continues to build his reputation.

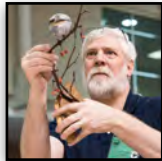

4. Any visual identifying marks will be covered during the competition.
5. A deep brand with carvers name and date required on all Future Antique and Charles Bergman Antique entries.
6. Judges determinations are final and not subject to review.
7. The Show Chairman will have final authority on all show issues.
8. Carvers wishing to sell their entries must so indicate and specify the selling price on the entry tag. Checks should be made payable to the carver by the buyer. Carvings that have been sold may be picked up at the close of the show at 4pm on Sunday from the carver.
9. **There will be Open, Intermediate, and Novice Levels in all Divisions except, Bench, Mini-Decoy Floater Trader, Charles Bergman Contest, Will Hayden Award, Helen Foster Award, Cocktail Carvings and IWCA Open Working Decoy Championship.**

One of the goals of the Feather and Quill Carving Club, co-sponsor of the annual Columbia Flyway Wildlife Show, is honoring the legendary carvers who laid the foundation for the carvers of today.

In keeping with that, the club is sponsoring a novel new competition for this year’s 32<sup>nd</sup> annual show, slated for September 14 and 15 in Vancouver, Washington. The aim is to determine who among today’s practitioners can best replicate a Charles Bergman’s show-stopping mallard decoy.

Originals can be found in private and museum collections and various auction venues. Photographic renditions can be found on numerous websites.

The Ward Museum of Wildfowl Art, which sponsors the annual Ward World Wildfowl Championships, features a noteworthy original in its holdings in Salisbury, Maryland.

One or more local experts in the work of the legendary Astoria carver will be tapped to decide which of the contemporary antiques entered in the competition are most worthy. Three places will be awarded.

The Columbia Flyway is known for its great waterfowl hunting, generating the need for realistic and effective decoys to lure birds into range.

Lying at the mouth of the one of world’s mightiest rivers, the majestic Columbia, Astoria is a major stopover on the Flyway. As a result, it has long been a rich source of heralded decoy carvers.

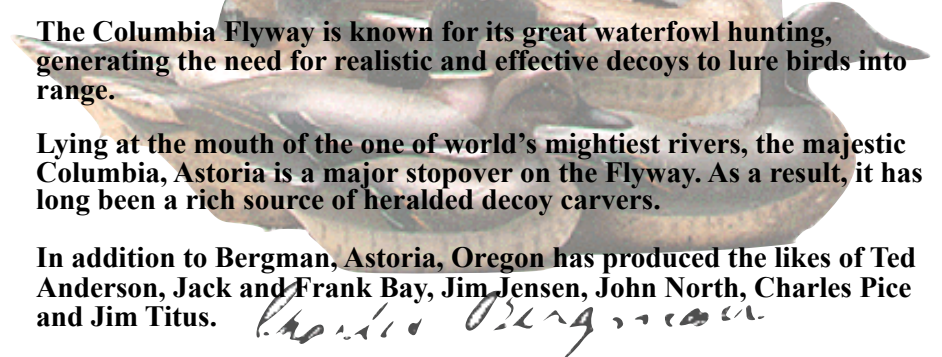
In addition to Bergman, Astoria, Oregon has produced the likes of Ted Anderson, Jack and Frank Bay, Jim Jensen, John North, Charles Pice and Jim Titus.

The competition is designed to honor their work, which laid the foundation for that being turned out by the top carvers of our time.

**Division CBD. Charles Bergman Mallard Contest “New for 2019”**

Carvers will carve a replica of a Charles Bergman full size Drake Mallard. Entries will not be floated and do not need to self-right. Carvings may be finished by traditional painting or by antiquing methods. No modern painting techniques, such as airbrush, etc. Carvers may find a basic pattern for this contest on the Columbia Flyway Wildlife Show website ([columbiaflywaywildlifeshow.com](http://columbiaflywaywildlifeshow.com)) The 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winning Bergman decoys will be auctioned at the banquet for a 50/50 split between the artist and the Columbia Flyway Wildlife Show plus the winners receive cash awards for Best of Division Open: 1<sup>st</sup> \$100, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$75, 3<sup>rd</sup> \$50.
